# AICA to Visit King Ranch!

**Saturday, March 25, 2017**



\$50 ticket includes transportation, a guided tour, lunch, admission to the King Ranch Museum and Saddle Shop.

## **Guided Historical Tour**

The journey begins at the historic Santa Gertrudis Creek where Captain King first camped in 1852. Nearby, modern brush clearing equipment, land-going leviathans conceived and developed on King Ranch to clear mesquite and huisache from the pastures, has found a permanent parking place. Continuing your trip, your guide will explain the history and the modern day workings of the Ranch. You will see the Calera Pens where at roundup time the cattle are vaccinated, branded, and tagged. Keen eyes will spot wildlife along the way, and our wildlife tours are a totally separate program. Tours will pass the Auction Arena, the horse cemetery, and the Colony – home of the Kinenos or King's Men. Historic buildings include Mrs. King's Carriage House, the Commissary with its lookout tower, the show barn, and the grand home built in 1912 by Captain King's widow, Henrietta.

## **King Ranch Cowboy Camphouse Barbeque**

Ring the cook's dinner bell and experience a barbeque at an historic King Ranch cowboy camphouse. Lunch includes beef brisket and smoked sausage prepared over a mesquite wood fire!

## **King Ranch Museum Admission**

The museum is the definitive repository of ranch lore and the items on display clearly evoke the bygone days on Captain King's legendary spread. The King Ranch Museum's permanent collections include: Toni Frissell's award-winning photographic essay of life on King Ranch in the early 1940's; saddles from around the world, guns, and rifles including a King Ranch commemorative Colt Python .357 magnum revolver (serial number KR1), a limited edition series of full-scale replicas of historic Republic of Texas flags, and antique carriages and vintage cars, including El Kineño, a custom designed Buick Eight hunting car built for Congressman R. M. Kleberg, Sr., in 1949 by General Motors. Upon arriving at the King Ranch Museum, you are welcomed with a bronze sculpture of Mrs. Henrietta King and her son-in-law Robert J. Kleberg, Sr., as well as a sculpture of the first artesian well that was drilled on King Ranch in the summer of 1899. Visitors can view videos about the history of King Ranch and its main residence. Enjoy the current temporary exhibit Echos in the Dust: Memories from the Cattle Trails.

## **King Ranch Saddle Shop.**

Located a few minutes away from the King Ranch Museum and the King Ranch Visitor Center, you will have the chance to shop our leather goods and outdoor gear at the store to take home. The King Ranch Saddle Shop continues to practice what the early saddlemakers had learned. In materials, only the best is good enough, and in styling, simplicity has its own elegance
